They must include their scientific question (e.g. which material conducts electricity the best?), a write up of what they did, a conclusion and graphs, tables or photographs to support their findings. 


Volunteers Needed

Safer Internet Day 2025

On Tuesday 11th February it was Safer Internet Day. Year groups have been discussing Internet Safety in their computing or PSHE lessons. This year the theme is, "Too Good to Be True? Protecting Yourself and Others from Scams Online," highlighting a crucial issue to support young people with identifying and avoiding online scams.

The aim is to ask questions like:

- How is changing technology like generative AI going to impact the approach of scammers?
- · What role can the government and internet industry take to tackle this threat?
