On Thursday, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Ascension, with Father Paul leading us in Mass. Father Paul helped us to reflect on the joyful season of Easter and reminded us of the three great solemnities we celebrate: Easter Sunday, the Ascension and Pentecost.

As part of our continued effort to improve our liturgy, we also invite pupils to reflect on their experiences. Jesus reminds us in the Gospel of that day:

“I am with you always, to the very end of the age.” (Matthew 28:20)

This message gives us comfort and hope, reminding us that even as Jesus ascended into heaven, He remains with us in our daily lives.
